The [Summer School](#) is organized for 15th consecutive year and is designed for professionals working in the wider areas of **Competition Policy and Network Industry Regulation**. The School provides a comprehensive account of the most up to date developments in economic theory, empirical analysis, legislation and policy in the areas of Competition and Regulation. Participants of the Summer School join a vibrant community of motivated students from all over the world and a [distinguished international faculty](#). The Contents are organised in 8 self-contained [Modules](#) of up to 16 hours duration each. Particular emphasis is placed on the presentation and discussion of Case Studies.

CRESSE offers each year a number of [Advanced Short Courses](#) in specific topics of Competition Policy (the topics may change from year to year). These are targeted to the more experienced professionals working in competition authorities or regulatory bodies or in consultancy companies who are trained in economics at undergraduate and postgraduate level (**including chief economists, directors of economics, senior case handlers and senior analysts**). They are also directed to those interested in competition economics who, while already trained at postgraduate level in microeconomic theory and industrial organization,

may have had limited opportunity for focused study in the field. The Courses can be attended on a stand-alone basis or by those participating in the Summer School.

✳️ **7th CRESSE Lawyers' Course on The Role of Economics in Competition Law and Practice**

Friday, June 26 - Monday, June 29, 2020

The [Lawyers' Course](#) is organized for 7th consecutive year and is targeted to lawyers practicing in competition law as counsels, enforcers or judges or in another field of law in which knowledge of economics is helpful. The course is taught by some of the [foremost competition economists in the world](#). It covers both an introduction to microeconomics, game theory and industrial organization theory, as well as, all the areas in the application of economics to competition policy. The Course is organized in 16 sessions of 2 academic hours each.

✳️ **2nd CRESSE - OECD Executive Programme (CALEP)**

Saturday, June 27 - Wednesday, July 1, 2020

Since 2019, CRESSE co-organises with the OECD Competition Division the [Competition Agency Leaders Executive Programme \(CALEP\)](#). CALEP is a yearly executive training taught by eminent competition professors, lawyers, economists and members of the OECD secretariat. The course is tailored to be an essential professional development opportunity for Leaders / Heads and emerging Leaders of competition agencies, Commissioners, Board Members and Senior Officials (Directors General and other high-level officers) of competition and other regulatory agencies throughout the world. A multidisciplinary approach is followed, with courses in competition economics and law and in management taught by leading experts with deep expertise and vast practical experience in competition law and its enforcement from academia, policy world and from the private and public sector. Participants are not required to have any prior knowledge of economics or quantitative techniques. Classes are delivered in-person and presentation materials are designed to help delivery of key concepts and special emphasis is given in drawing on case and real-world examples in order to review and apply the principles and methods. The Course is organized in 18 sessions of 2 academic hours each.
