Prof. Frank Verboven (University of KU Leuven)

Frank Verboven is Professor of economics at University of KU Leuven, Researcher at Centre for Economic Policy Research, the chief editor of International Journal of Industrial Organization. Frank Verboven mainly investigates Competition, Convergence, Industrial organization, Price dispersion and Microeconomics. His research covers topics such as mergers, cartels, vertical restrictions, and entry, involving industries as diverse as automotive, telecommunications, pharmaceuticals, healthcare, and local services. His publications include articles in American Economic Review, Review of Economic Studies, RAND Journal of Economics, International Journal of Industrial Organization, Journal of Industrial Economics.

Prof. Kate Rockett (University of Essex)

Kate Rockett holds a PhD from University of California, Berkeley. She is now Professor at University of Essex. Her research interests include the economics of new technologies, firm organisation and licensing. Recent publications include a report for the European Commission on the interplay between intellectual property and competition policy and articles in the Journal of Public Economics and Journal of Industrial Economics.

Dr. Pierre Régibeau (University of Essex)

Pierre Régibeau holds a PhD in economics from University of California, Berkeley. He is now a visiting Research Fellow at Imperial College's IP Centre, and a Honorary Professor at University of Essex. Pierre Régibeau specializes in the field of industrial organisation, law and economics and international business with a strong experience of economic consultancy. Dr. Régibeau has worked on numerous cases involving mergers, competition inquiries at the European Commission and national competition authorities. Since 1987 he has held teaching positions at the Sloan School of Management (MIT), the Kellogg School of Management (Northwestern University), the University of Barcelona and INSEAD. In the last few years, his work has mostly focused on network industries and high-tech industries.

Prof. Simon Loertscher (University of Melbourne)

Simon Loertscher holds a PhD in economics from the University of Bern. He is Professor of economics at the University of Melbourne and the Director of the Centre for Market Design. His research focuses on industrial organization, competition policy and mechanism design. He is an associated editor at the Journal of Economic Theory and the Journal of Industrial Economics and a member of the editorial board at AEJ: Microeconomics. His recent publications include articles in the American Economic Review, the Journal of Political Economy, and Management Science.

Prof. Bruno Jullien (Toulouse School of Economics)

Bruno Jullien graduated from Ecole Polytechnique, ENSAE and EHESS. He holds a PhD in economics from Harvard University. He is Senior Researcher at CNRS and TSE, and a Fellow of Econometric Society, CEPR, CESifo and CMPO. His research interests cover industrial organization, in particular network economics, IT, competition policy and the economics of multi-sided platforms. His research work has been published in such leading scholarly journals as the Journal of Public Economics, Review of Economic Studies, Journal of industrial

Dr. Keith Weahrer (Secretariat Economists)

Keith Weahrer is widely recognized as an expert in antitrust economics. In particular, Dr. Weahrer has authored highly regarded papers on the analysis of competitive effects from mergers in auction markets and on the impact of overlapping minority shareholdings on competition. He has worked on some of the highest profile United States antitrust litigation in recent years, including *State of New York et al. v. T-Mobile-Sprint*, *FTC v. Qualcomm*, and *United States v. AT&T-Time Warner*. Dr. Weahrer has been named to Global Competition Review's list of International Who's Who of Competition Economists in 2012, 2018, 2019, and 2020.

Prof. Yannis Katsoulaco(Athens University of Economics and Business)

Yannis Katsoulacos is Emeritus Professor, Athens University of Economics and Business and Affiliated Chair Professor, Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics, China (2021 –). He was Visiting Professor, ESSEC Business School, Paris, 2019 – 2020. Visiting Professor at the LSE European Institute (2018 – 19). Professor of Economics at the Department of Economic Science of the Athens University of Economics and Business (AUEB) (1989 – 2020). He has been the University Vice Rector for Academic Affairs (2007-2011) and Director of the Department's Program of Post-graduate Studies (2000-2004). He directed the Executive MSc in Applied Economics and Finance (2003 – 2018). He got his MSc and his PhD in Economics from the London School of Economics (Supervisor: John Sutton) and he has been teaching Theory of Industrial Organization, Economics of Competition and Regulation Policy, and Economics of Technological Change and Innovation at under-graduate and post-graduate level. His main research interests are in areas of Competition Policy and Regulation and the Economics of Technical Change and Innovation.

In 2005 he initiated and since then he is in charge for organizing the CRESSE Annual International Summer School and Conference in Competition and Regulation (www.cresse.info). CRESSE has also been organising a Lawyers' Course in Competition Economics, the CALEP Executive Program (for agency leaders) jointly with OECD and Executive Training seminars in the areas of the economics of competition and regulation in many countries throughout the world.

Prof. Guofu Tan (University of South California)

Guofu Tan holds a PhD in economics from California Institute of Technology. He is currently a professor of Economics at the University of Southern California. Previously, he held the positions of Associate Professor and Assistant professor of Economics at the University of British Columbia and Associate Professor of Economics at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. He is also a visiting professor at Tsinghua University (Beijing), Cheung Kong Graduate School of Business (Beijing), and Shanghai University of Finance and Economics. His research focuses on business strategy and industrial organization, competition and regulatory policies, auction theory, and microeconomics with applications. His research work has been published in such leading scholarly journals as the *American Economic Review*, *Econometrica*, *Review of Economic Studies*, *RAND Journal of Economics*, *Journal of Economic Theory*, *International Journal of Industrial Organization*, as well as many others. He was the deputy editor of *International Economic Review* and *International Journal of Industrial Organization*.
